Students will be trained and be able to correctly demonstrate to the instructors the tactics, equipment requirements, logistics, video documentation and debriefing procedures. Students will be trained on individual assignments of entry teams such as officer positions and responsibilities. All training and demonstrations will be structured around and in compliance with the departments use of force policies.

**Performance Objectives**

a) Correctly answer questions regarding policy & procedure regarding the use of force, use of restraints and the need and use medical staff. b) Demonstrate the procedure and steps in pre-entry planning and briefing. c) Demonstrate the correct application of protective equipment to their bodies. d) Articulate the reasons for the assignment of entry team positions as defined in the SERT Policy & Procedure. e) Demonstrate the proper operation of video equipment. f) Demonstrate the procedure and reasons for assisting team mates during practical exercise. g) Identify the reasons why visual and physical obstructions in a dormitory, should be identified and addressed and demonstrate the procedure for doing so. h) Demonstrate the proper procedure (verbal commands and physical movement) for performing tactical team movements, ie; entry, scirmish lines, shielding for protection, clearing restrooms, janitorial closets, breaching barricades and tactical withdrawal from the dormitory. i) Verbally articulate and physically demonstrate cell extraction techniques. j) Demonstrate the procedure for safely extracting inmates from affected areas using the lowest level of force available. k) Identify possible alternate methods of extracting inmates from a dormitory, including dynamic entry and the use of less lethal gas or pepper spray and verbally articulate the reasons for there use and Use of Force issues which may be present. l) Demonstrate entry's using gas mask after deploying chemical agents. Identify safety issues which could result from the use of chemical agents. m) Demonstrate search techniques for searching a dormitory for contraband, includes tagging evidence and reporting. n) Verbally articulate the reasons for obtaining medical clearance for inmates, as well as reporting injuries to officer or self. o) Conduct and or participate in post-entry debriefing. Identify issues which should be discussed, and after incident actions to be taken.
