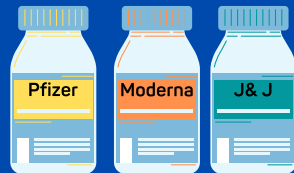









A Guide to the Approved COVID-19 Vaccines



Millions of people in the United States have received COVID-19 vaccines under the most intense safety monitoring in U.S. history. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends everyone to get a COVID-19 vaccine as soon as possible.

 <p>Age Requirement</p>	12 + years	18+ years	18+ years
 <p>Doses Required</p>	2 doses, 21 days apart	2 doses, 28 days apart	1 dose
 <p>Common Side Effects</p>	Common side effects include swelling, redness, and pain at the injection site, fever, headache, tiredness, muscle pain, chills or nausea.		
 <p>Effectiveness</p>	COVID-19 vaccines are effective and are a critical tool to help bring the pandemic under control.		
 <p>Long-Term Effects</p>	Serious side effects that could cause a long-term health problem are extremely unlikely following any vaccination, including COVID-19 vaccination.		
 <p>Chronic Illness</p>	COVID-19 vaccines are recommended for people with underlying medical conditions.		
 <p>Pregnant</p>	Getting a COVID-19 vaccine during pregnancy can protect from severe illness from COVID-19.
